#### 1. Program

- O **Objective** : To foster global ESG Leaders, who are interested in, and capable of solving social problems
- O Duration : July 2 (Sun.) July 12 (Wed.), 2023 \* In total, 5 weeks (Pre- 2 weeks, on-site 2 weeks, post- 1 week)

**Venue** : **POSCO Center(Seoul), Steelworks & POSTECH(Pohang)** \* accommodation nearby POSCO Center

O Target : Outstanding POSCO Asia Fellows studying at partner univ. (17 Univ. from 9 Countries) & POSCO Vision Fellows

- \* China, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmmar, Kazakhstan, Korea, Thailand, Turkiye, Vientam
- \*\* 2022 postgraduates fellows of University of Indonesia are also eligible for the program
- Scale : 30 students from 10 Countries (Korea 13, Asia 17; 1 from each univ.) / 5 global teams (6 ppl. / team)

\* Note: All expenses are covered and borne by the Foundation (Round-trip flights, Accommodation, Activities etc.)

- O Capacity : 30 outstanding students from 10 countries (including Korea, 1 from each university)
- Method : Submit your application on an application platform of the Foundation (→postf.recruiter.co.kr)
  - \* note: if you want to see application items in your mother tongue, you are encouraged to use Chrome browser

○ Stage : (1<sup>st</sup>) Document Screening(twice as many; F)  $\rightarrow$  (2<sup>nd</sup>) Interview(F+B+U)  $\rightarrow$  (3<sup>rd</sup>, Final) Selection(F)

- (Document) the Foundation will evaluation application forms and the result will be informed by email (2 from each univ.)
- (Interview) virtual interview (zoom) w/ nterviewers(from F, B, U) (English, 9 times in total, by country)
- (Final Selection) total sum of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> Stage's score (results to be notified to each individual applicant)
